you have notified us in your registration form, that your child has an anaphylaxis reaction to an allergen that requires immediate medication through an automated injection pen (epi pen). therefore, we would like to get more information about the severity and the early symptoms so that we can provide the best care at all times.

- (1) whilst the site is nut free and we do our best to keep the site free of allergens, friends on the hill cannot guarantee that the environment is free of allergens.
- (2) should an emergency arise, the staff of the club has been trained to the standard of paediatric first aid and have been trained to use an epi pen.
- (3) for a child with anaphylaxis, parents must indicate the allergy on the registration form. in response, this form will be emailed to the parent and must be completed before their first session at the camp and two in date epi-pens must be left at the site.
- (4) this form and the medication is kept in the medicine cabinet at the crypt away from children or any unauthorised people.
- (5) if in an emergency, the medication has been administered to the child, an ambulance will be called immediately. during the wait for the ambulance staff will stay with the child for observation and form will be completed by a second member of staff. after administration of the epi-pen, the child must always go to hospital and the parents will be notified.
